# SIZZLING SCIENCE CAMPS

## CAMP POLICIES

These policies have been put in place for the health and safety of your child.

### WELL CHILD POLICY:

Please do NOT bring your child to camp with the following symptoms

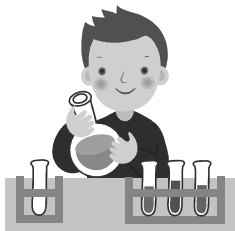
- Undiagnosed or unexplained pain
- Sore throat or difficulty swallowing
- Nausea and vomiting
- Wheezing or persistent coughing
- Communicable disease (ex: head lice, chicken pox)
- Unexplained diarrhea with nausea cramps, or vomiting
- Severe itching, unexplained rash or infection

If your child does become ill please inform staff, this will help us reduce the spread of common illnesses. This information is kept in confidence.

### CHILD RELEASE POLICY

Your child will only be released to someone whose name is on the Child Pick Up List (appears on registration form).

People coming to pick up your child should bring photo ID.



### WHAT TO BRING- be prepared for anything!

**LUNCH:** no nut products and no microwave access

**SNACKS-** two snack times each day

**OUTSIDE GEAR-** this means rain gear if it is raining and a hat and sunscreen if it is sunny.

**WATER BOTTLE-** please put your name on it

### WE ARE NUT FREE:

Some campers have severe nut allergies.

Please do not allow your child to bring nuts or any nut products to camp.

### LATE PICK-UPS

If you are going to be late picking up your child please phone us at **250-631-9045**. If no one has arrived by 3:30pm to pick up your child, staff will start calling people listed on the registration form until someone is reached and pick-up arrangements are made.
